Your Club's Financial Health -It is a new year and you have agreed to some changes that will definitely help the financial situation of the flying club. The increase in dues from \$45.00 to \$55.00 per month will result in an increase of projected income of over \$11,000. This will greatly offset some expenses and reduce the projected loss for 2007. Yes, the budget for 2007 shows a projected loss. Some items are included as income but their status is unknown, like the possibility of loosing the Boeing stipend (\$5,000 in 2006). The club's 2007 budget is in the range of \$175,000. While

the loss of the Boeing stipend will not cripple us, it is a substantial amount of money that will have to be made up somewhere else.
